#### **PROGRAM SUBMISSIONS**

If you are new at this and unsure how the program submission process works, let me explain.

During your workday, you may encounter obstacles in implementing one of FSA's various programs and determined that there is a better process to accomplish the same goal. There are two ways to send a program submission.

1) Manual submissions can be completed by using the **Manual Programs Efficiency Submission Form**. After completing the manual form, you will email as an attachment to your respective Area Programs Chair listed below.

2) Online submissions can be completed by clicking on the ONLINE Submission Form Link under your respective Area Programs Chair (see below). Just follow the online instructions given on the webpage in order to submit your item.

NASCOE's Programs Page provides a delivery conduit for your constructive ideas/solutions/recommendations directly to the National Office with the end result to streamline program delivery. Also, you can use this as an opportunity to voice your support for the processes that work well, to hopefully encourage similar types of strategies and ideas that are already successful.
